

**CFA Resolution in Support of Hayward Teachers
Adopted by the CFA Assembly April 2007**

Whereas, Hayward Unified School District gave its highest paid administrators a 16.84% increase making them the highest paid administrators of comparable districts and offered teachers only 3%, making them the lowest paid teachers; and

Whereas, the low pay received by teachers in the Hayward School District is forcing teachers to leave the school district and those who do teach must pay for their own health coverage; some pay over \$10,000 a year for this health insurance; and

Whereas, on April 5, 2007 over 98% of the teachers in the Hayward School District went on strike for better wages, working conditions, and to protect the quality of education in Hayward, and after the end of the second day of the strike the superintendent decided to take a week's vacation; and

Whereas, teachers from all over California unequivocally supported CFA's struggle in their most recent battle for a fair and decent contract; therefore be it

Resolved, that President John Travis send a letter expressing our support of the Hayward teachers strike to Kathleen Crummey, President of the Hayward Education Association and that copies of this letter should be sent to Dale Vigil, Hayward Unified School District Superintendent and Barbara Kerr, President of the California Teachers Association.
