Dear California State University (CSU) Faculty and Students,

We understand that CSU faculty are preparing to withhold their labor in a five-day system-wide strike on April 13-15 and 18-19, 2016. As volunteers with local chapters of the ACLU of Northern California, spanning as far north as the Oregon border and as far south as the Central Coast and Central Valley, we work to ensure everyone in this country knows their rights so they can execute them freely. We are writing this letter so that you have practical information about your rights to free speech and protest.

Freedom of speech is a constitutional guarantee protected by the First Amendment. All campuses should adhere to First Amendment principles because academic freedom is a bedrock of education in a free society. The mission of a university is to facilitate learning through open debate and study, and to enlighten. All views are entitled to be heard, explored, supported or refuted.

Freedom of the press, protected by the First Amendment, is critical to a democracy in which the government is accountable to the people. A free media functions as a watchdog that can investigate and report on government wrongdoing. It is also a vibrant marketplace of ideas, a vehicle for ordinary citizens to express themselves and gain exposure to a wide range of information and opinions. And your right to protest means you can dissent, demonstrate, and make your voice heard.

In the United States, students do not lose their constitutional rights “at the schoolhouse gate.” The protection of students’ constitutional rights – in and out of school – is essential for ensuring that schools provide both quality education and training in our democratic system and values.
