

United Faculty of Florida (FEA, NEA, AFT, AFL-CIO), representing 23,000 faculty, professional employees, and graduate assistants in eleven public universities, eight public colleges and community colleges, and one independent university, strongly support the struggle of CFA faculty at East Bay and Dominguez Hills on November 17 for more funding for instruction and less funding for exorbitant salaries of those who run the system. It is shocking to see the skewed priorities of Chancellor Charlie Reed, who drove down funding for instruction to 35% of the budget while driving up the salaries of top administrators. At the same time students were taxed for this skewed system through burdensome new and ever-increasing fees.
