#### Changing Faces of California State University Faculty and Students: A Summary of Data on the Racial/Ethnic and Gender Diversity in the CSU

This report updates and expands on the report and data prepared for CFA's Equity Conference in 2003. The figures and tables in the pages that follow provide a snapshot of the CSU faculty and students, both systemwide and at the campus-level. Particular attention is given to the gender and racial/ethnic diversity of CSU instructional faculty and students because of the availability of such data. Some data pertaining to all of Unit 3 (instructional faculty, counselors, librarians, and coaches) are also included in this report. The tables and figures are grouped into eight broad categories (see Table of Contents), but there are numerous ways that they could have been organized. If you don't see the data you are looking for right away, it might be in a different section. In most cases, data are presented in terms of both headcount (the total number of individuals) and full-time equivalents. Data tables follow most charts, to show the data in both more and less detail and so that further analysis can be conducted independently when needed. Although in this report, analysis is limited, in favor of descriptive data, the numbers and charts reveal patterns that suggest both progress and areas in which there is room for improvement. The report is intended as a tool for CFA activists. We hope the information included in this report will inspire your advocacy, assist you in your activism, and support the work that is needed to transform our systems into more ones that are more equitable and just.

#### Overview

- As of fall 2005, there 23,797 active (not on leave) faculty members in the bargaining unit represented by the California Faculty Association. About 95 percent of the unit are instructional faculty. Over half are lecturers with temporary appointments. In full-time equivalents, over a third of the 15,940 FTE faculty are lecturers.
- Forty-three percent of the women and 42 percent of the men in the bargaining unit are members. Systemwide, Latino/as have the highest membership rate, relative to other racial/ethnic groups. Humboldt and San Francisco campuses have the highest rate of membership, each with 55 percent.
- Growth in temporary appointments continues to outpace growth in tenure-track appointments. In 2005, there were 3,573 more temporary instructional faculty members and only 93 more tenure line instructional faculty members than there were twenty years ago. Tenure line faculty are still predominantly male while temporary faculty are predominantly female, though the gaps are much smaller than they were twenty years ago. Unit 3 is still overwhelmingly white. Some progress towards increasing the racial/ethnic diversity is occurring, however. Today, while 76 percent of full professors are white, 63 percent of assistant professors identify as white, and only 60 percent of new tenure-track faculty hired for 2004 were white. In 2004, 80 percent of all doctorate recipients (US citizens at US institutions) were white.

- The most significant inequities concerning salary are arguably related to the large and continuously growing gap (the so-called "CPEC-gap") between CSU salaries and salaries paid to professors at the CSU's comparison institutions across the country. The same patterns of salary compression and inversion that are being experienced by faculty nationwide are also affecting the distribution of salaries in the CSU. However, these patterns are not analyzed in this report. Data analyzed for this conference do show that at all ranks, and across all racial/ethnic categories, men in the CSU earn more than women, on average. The differences are not always very large, and in calculating these averages, we have not controlled for important factors such as years of experience or discipline. Therefore, these data *do not* attempt to demonstrate gender discrimination. A more thorough examination of the salary data would need to be conducted before the validity of such conclusions could be considered. Of course, undeniable structural inequality exists throughout academia, and the CSU is no exception. Professors in some disciplines, which tend to be overwhelming male, are paid far more than are professors in other disciplines, many of which are today comprised of more women than men. In 2005, the newly hired assistant professors in the highest paid discipline (Accounting) were paid, on average, about \$32,000 more than those in the lowest paid discipline (Communications). (The annual report on faculty recruitment, prepared by the CSU Human Resources department, is a helpful source of data for this pattern in the CSU. The report is cited in the References to this report).
- The CSU student body is very diverse, and the CSU is often described as the most diverse university system in the country. In many ways, the racial/ethnic composition of CSU students reflects the diversity in the state. Women students far outnumber men, across all racial/ethnic categories. In particular, enrollment of Black/African American and Latino men lags far behind the women. This gender gap has persisted for many years and over the past few years has grown larger. The Los Angeles and Dominguez Hills campuses are probably the most diverse in terms of racial/ethnic diversity of both students and faculty. The Sonoma, Chico, Humboldt campuses are among the least representative of the state's population.
- The California Postsecondary Education Commission has compiled data on the number of students with reported disabilities (such as visual or hearing impairments, learning disabilities, and physical impairments) since 1999. Though the large majority of CSU students are able-bodied with no known and reported disabilities, in 2004, 2.5 percent of the students reported a disability.
- California's population continues to change as it grows, with the greatest increase projected for Latino/as over the next few decades. However, as current college enrollment patterns suggest, Latino/as are underrepresented in the CSU (relative to their representation in the state) and in higher education more broadly. The Public Policy Institute of California's recent report, California 2025 draws attention to the implications of these two intersecting trends, and highlights an expectation that the state's employers will demand more workers with a college education than the state is likely to supply unless rates of participation of underrepresented groups improves significantly.

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







## Percent of Male CSU Instructional Faculty, by Campus: Fall 2005





### CSU Instructional Faculty (FTE), by Gender, 1985-2005




#### CSU DISTRIBUTION OF INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY, BY GENDER: 1985 TO 2004








### Percent of New CSU Tenure Track Faculty who Identify as White

## Percent of New CSU Tenure Track Faculty who were Women











# Racial/Ethnic Diversity of CSU Faculty, New Tenure Line Faculty, and California's Population




# Racial/Ethnic Diversity of Instructional Faculty in the CSU and US Public 4-Yr Institutions: 2003








# CSU Systemwide Enrollment, by Race/Ethnicity (Headcount)

## Percent of CSU Students who Identify as White: 1985-2004









## Distribution of US and California Population, by Race/Ethnicity: 2004



# Distribution of California Population, by Race/Ethnicity: 1980, 1990, 2000




# Distribution of US Population, by Race/Ethnicity: 1980, 1990, 2000


# Changes in the Racial/Ethnic Composition of California's Population: 1970 to 2050

#### CSU PIMS Database

The primary source of data for tables and charts pertaining to CSU faculty is the CSU Personnel Information Management System (PIMS) database. This data, in its raw form, is essentially a "snapshot" of each paycheck issued to an individual in the bargaining unit, in given month. CFA analyzes PIMS data, which is provided by the CSU, and has PIMS datasets for instructional faculty dating back to 1985.
