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A summary of the data on the racial/ethnic and gender diversity in the CSU

This report updates and expands on the reports and data prepared for CFA's Equity Conferences in 2003 and 2006. The figures and tables in the pages that follow provide a snapshot of the CSU faculty and students, both systemwide and at the campus-level. Particular attention is given to the gender and racial/ethnic diversity of CSU instructional faculty and students because of the availability of such data. Additional data pertaining to all of Unit 3 (instructional faculty, counselors, librarians, and coaches) are also included in this report. The tables and figures are grouped into eight broad categories (see Table of Contents), but there are numerous ways that they could have been organized. If you don't see the data you are looking for right away, it might be in a different section. In most cases, data are presented in terms of both headcount (the total number of individuals) and full-time equivalents (an aggregate count of part-time positions or enrollment). This databook is intended as a tool for CFA activists and information might not be presented in a format that suits your needs but hopefully includes enough details so activists can format the data most relevant to the campaign or project on which they are working. We hope the information included here will inspire your advocacy, assist you in your activism, and support the work that is needed to transform our systems into more ones that are more equitable and just.

This databook is a little smaller than the one that was prepared for the last conference, however, if you are working on a project for which updated data would be helpful and it is not included here, we can help you find it! 




CSU Instructional Faculty by Tenure Status, 1985 - 2007 (Headcount)


CSU Distribution of Instructional Faculty, by Gender: 1985 to 2007






Tenure Track Faculty Appointments, By Ethnicity, Fall 2006


Full-time Tenured Faculty, By Ethnicity, Fall 2006

Race/Ethnicity of Doctoral Recipients* Who Earned Degrees from US Universities in 2006






Percent of Doctoral Recipients by Racial/Ethnic Minority Group: 1996 and 2006 (US Citizens who Identified their Race/Ethnicity)


Percent of CSU Students and Instructional Faculty Who Identify as White, 1997





CFA has PIMS datasets for instructional faculty dating back to 1985.

The SED gathers information annually from 45,000 new U.S. research doctorate graduates about their educational histories, funding sources, and post-doctoral plans.
