

A LOOK AT ASIAN AMERICAN DEMOGRAPHIC DATA AT THE CSU

The way the CSU categorizes all Asian faculty under one "Asian" umbrella term is <u>highly limiting.</u> The CSU creates only one subcategory for Asian American faculty—a Pacific Islander demographic category. However, we suspect the collection of Pacific Islander data to be <u>incomplete at best.</u>

Asian and Pacific Islander <u>activists have been calling for the</u> breaking up, or <u>disaggregation</u>, of Asian demographic data into smaller, more representative sub-categories for <u>decades</u>.

Why is one demographic category for all Asian American faculty insufficient?

- Tremendous <u>differences in lived experience</u>, historical conditions and oppression across various countries and regions in Asia.
- Highly <u>divergent experiences of immigration</u> between Asian demographic groups.
- > Over-simplifying Asian faculty data directly <u>contributes to the myth</u> of Asian Americans being a <u>"model minority"</u> and the myth that Asian Americans are over-represented in academia.


