AB 1919 Holden (D)	Youth Transit Pass Pilot Program Requires local authorities, school districts, and colleges to maintain their funding for free or reduced fare youth transit as provided in the 2018-19 fiscal year. Requires transit agencies to offer free youth transit passes to all persons 25 years of age and under with California residency, regardless of immigration status, in order to be eligible for state funding. Provides that the amount of the credit would be equal to the lesser of the federal student loan debt of the qualified taxpayer or \$10,000.
