## What faculty can do:



Follow the money at campus budget meetings. Bring some colleagues, and ask:

- How many courses are being eliminated as a result of admin's push to increase faculty-to student-ratios in our classes?
- How many faculty positions could be sustained if funding went to instruction and students, instead of buildings or parking lots?
- How does cutting courses, taking work away from lecturers, and increasing everyone else's workloads support student learning and success?
- At what rate has campus police spending increased since (insert date)?
- How is management ensuring cuts don't come at the cost of student success?
- How are we centering our goals related to diversity, equity, and inclusion in how the campus moves forward with budget cuts? What is the anticipated impact to our first-generation and BIPOC students?
- What is the current faculty-to-management (MPP) ratio and why is reducing the number of MPP positions not part of the conversation?
