



## 2026 Legislative Priorities

### **SPONSORED BILLS**

Updated: April 27, 2026

- **AB 1831 (Ahrens): CSU Executive Compensation** would limit executive compensation to 125% of the CA Governor's salary (\$307,411/year). This bill would also prohibit executive salary increases in years when student tuition increases and would undo the 2025 executive compensation increases by 2027.
  - **Passed Assembly Higher Education Committee on 3/17/26 (vote: 8-1-1).**
  - **Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.**
- **AB 2068 (Connolly): CSU Presidential Search** would create a presidential search process that centers campus community needs and input when selecting a campus president.
  - **Passed Assembly Higher Education Committee on 4/21/26 (vote: 7-3).**
  - **Status: Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.**
- **AB 2523 (Fong): Public Accessibility in Higher Ed Governing Boards** would require the CSU and California Community Colleges and request the UC to post on their websites the name, a short bio, and the contact information (used for conducting official business) of each member of their governing body: email address, phone number, and mailing address.
  - **Passed Assembly Higher Education Committee on 4/21/26 (vote: 10-0, on consent).**
  - **Status: Pending Committee Referral.**
- **SB 928 (Cervantes): Protections for CSU Faculty from AI Encroachments** would define that a faculty member be a real person, preventing them being replaced by AI. This bill would also require that an instructor of record for a course be a real person.
  - **Passed the Senate Floor on 4/15/26 (vote: 7-0, on consent).**
  - **Status: Assembly, pending committee referral.**
- **SB 1101 (Pérez): Sharing Personal Information Notice** would require the CSU and UC to notify faculty, students, and staff before information is shared with the federal government and would prohibit the CSU and UC from sharing information unless legally required.
  - **Passed Senate Education Committee on 4/08/26 (vote: 5-0-2).**
  - **Passed Senate Privacy Committee on 4/20/26 (vote: 7-1-1).**
  - **Status: Senate Appropriations Committee suspense file.**
